### Saint of the Day

Saint Tikhon of Zadonsk, was born in the year 1724 in the village of Korotsk. His father died when he was a young child, leaving the family in poverty. As a thirteen-year-old boy, he was sent to a clergy school near the Archbishop of Novgorod's residence and was accepted under a state grant. Excelling at his studies, he finished seminary in 1754, and began teaching. In the year 1758, he was tonsured with the name Tikhon. In 1761 he was among 8 nominated for an open episcopal see. Metropolitan Demetrios thought he was too young for that position, but agreed to submit his name. The lot fell on Archimandrite Tikhon three times. On the same day, during the Cherubic Hymn, Bishop Athanasios of Tver, without realizing it, commemorated him as a bishop, while cutting particles from the prosphora at the Table of Oblation. On May 13, 1761 he was consecrated as Bishop. In 1763, Saint Tikhon was transferred to the See of Voronezh. For the four and a half years that he administered the diocese of Voronezh. In 1767, poor health compelled him to give up running the diocese and withdraw for rest to a Monastery, in 1769, Bishop Tikhon was transferred to the Monastery of the Theotokos in the city of Zadonsk. Vladyka reposed, as was revealed to him, on Sunday August 13, 1783, at the age of fifty-nine. He was glorified on Sunday August 13, 1861.

Bishop Tikhon lived in very simple circumstances. Strict with himself, Vladyka was lenient toward others. He especially loved the common folk, and comforted them in their grievous lot, interceding with the landowners, and moving them to compassion. He gave away his pension, as well as gifts from his admirers, to the poor. The Saint advanced in contemplation of Heaven and foresaw the future, prophesying many future events in the Russian lands. He also foresaw his own death, and set out vestments and procured a coffin. The fruition of all his spiritual life were the books that the Saint wrote while in retirement: A Spiritual Treasury, Gathered from the World (1770), and On True Christianity (1776).


#### **Tone 7 Kontakion** (Feast)
