24th Sunday after Pentecost Prophet Obadiah, Martyr Barlaam of Caesarea

November 19th, 2023

Assigned Readings:

Ephesians 2:14-22 Luke 12:16-21

Saints of the Day:

When Ahab's wife, the impious and dissolute Jezebel, hunted down all the prophets of the Lord (because of her quarrel with the Prophet Elias), Obadiah gave them shelter and food. Ahab's successor sent three detachments of soldiers to arrest the holy Prophet Elias. One of these detachments was headed by the holy Prophet Obadiah. Through the prayer of the Prophet Elias, two of the detachments were consumed by heavenly fire, but Obadiah and his detachment were spared by the Lord.

From that moment Obadiah resigned from military service and became a follower of the Prophet Elias. Afterward, he himself received the gift of prophecy. The God-inspired work of the Prophet Obadiah is the fourth of the Books of the Twelve Minor Prophets in the Bible and contains predictions about the future salvation of the Gentiles and that the Savior would come forth from Sion.

The Holy Martyr Barlaam lived in Antioch of Syria. During Diocletian's persecution against Christians, the aged Saint Barlaam was arrested and brought to trial, where he confessed himself a Christian.

The judge, wanting to compel the saint to renounce Christ, ordered that Saint Barlaam be brought to the pagan altar. His right hand was placed over it, and a red-hot censer burning with incense was put into his hand. The torturer thought that a physically weak old man could not endure the pain and would drop it on the altar. In this way he would involuntarily be offering sacrifice to the idol. However, the saint held on to the censer until his hand fell off. After this, the holy Martyr Barlaam surrendered his soul to the Lord.

St. Basil the Great said of the Martyr Barlaam, "He had a hand stronger than fire." While St. John Chrysostom marveled that he was, "a man who was himself the altar of sacrifice, and the sacrifice, and the priest."

For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers Thou didst change weeping into joy, and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that Thou art <u>risen</u>, // granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

Troparion to St. Nicholas – Tone 4

The truth of things revealed you to your flock as a rule of faith, an icon of meekness and a teacher of abstinence. You thus reached the heights through humility and wealth through poverty. O Holy Hierarch Father Nicholas, // pray to Christ God for the salvation of our souls.

Kontakion of the Resurrection – Tone 7

The dominion of death can no longer hold men <u>captive</u>, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its <u>powers</u>. Hell is <u>bound</u>, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to <u>those</u> in faith;// enter, you faithful, into the Resurrection!"

Kontakion to St. Nicholas – Tone 3

You proved yourself to be a holy priest, O Nicholas; You served God in Myra and lived the gospel of Christ. You offered your life for your people; You rescued the innocent from death.// Therefore God has glorified you as a trustworthy guide of things divine.


Steadfast Protectress – Tone 6
